

Active Devon Coaches Bursary 2011/2012 FAQs

How are Bursaries allocated?

Bursaries will only be allocated through an application process by National Governing Bodies (NGBs). NGBs will identify coaches who meet their Whole Sport Plan priorities, meet the needs of Devon County Council's funding conditions and meet the eligibility criteria laid out for the scheme.

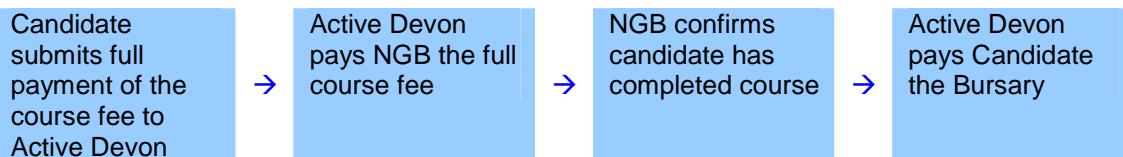
How are Bursaries distributed?

Following a panel assessment, NGB officers will be informed of the outcome of the application. Candidates will then be able to access the bursary by completing the **Active Devon Coach Bursary Registration Form**. Please refer to "What is the payment process?" question regarding payment of course fees and bursary. An agreed level of bursary will be returned to the candidate upon completion of the course (or at a timeline specified by the NGB).

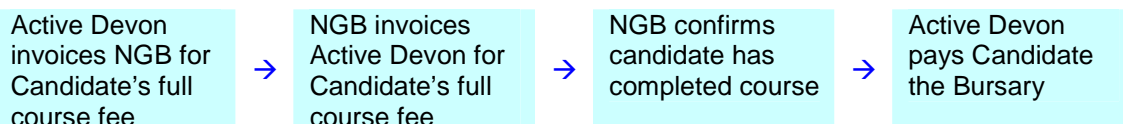
What is the payment process?

In order to satisfy Devon County Council Audit requirements, it will necessary to follow one of the following two payment processes:

What level of Bursary support is available?

Bursaries of up to 50% of the cost of the course will be made available to candidates identified as a priority to the NGB. This is subject to a maximum of £100 for Level 1, £150 for Level 2 and £500 for Level 3 qualifications.

What courses are eligible?

Any coaching awards or qualifications can be funded. These can be National Governing Body Awards or UKCC qualifications. Generic workshops such as First Aid or Equity in your Coaching are not eligible for funding.

Who decides which applications are supported?

Applications to receive bursary funding will be assessed by a panel of representatives from Active Devon and Devon County Council against specified criteria.

Why do I need to be registered on the Active Devon Coaches Database?

This database will enable coaches to access coaching education, development and training, coaching opportunities as well as allowing Active Devon to co-ordinate a need led County training programme.
